Job summary

Performs psychological testing (including psycho educational, objective and projective measures), assessment and writing of reports. Maintains working knowledge of recent psychological test updates and testing protocols. Prepares reports and/or treatment planning based on review of previous records, including psychological testing, medical records, and psycho educational testing and provides feedback to other clinicians for case management and consultation. Provides evidenced based treatment to children and their families. Participates in Agency-wide on-call and crisis walk-in coverage. Consults with other clinicians to aid in supervisory review and peer review of assigned patients. Develops and updates patient treatment plans based on evidenced-based treatment. Maintains consistent individual, group and collateral sessions with patients. Consults with schools, other involved agencies and support systems as clinically indicated. Documents patient treatment and progress for proper maintenance of patient's record. Develops and directs staff training. Develops and directs clinical care studies, patient care audits and patient profile analyses. Supervises unlicensed staff as necessary. Facilitates referrals to other CGC or outside programs as appropriate. Abides by the ethical standards promoted by the Board of Psychology as applicable.

Minimum requirements

Doctor of Philosophy or Psychology degree from an accredited academic institution required. California Psychology license or license-eligibility required. Minimum of three (3) years experience working with emotionally disturbed children and adolescents (preferably in both inpatient and outpatient settings) required. Some training is required in various psychometric instruments, including the validity and reliability of psychological tests and appropriate assessment use. An understanding of research methods, statistics, and the ability for formulating hypotheses is desired. Working knowledge of Medi-Cal and related regulations, including documentation requirements preferred. Bilingual in Spanish, Farsi, Korean or Vietnamese preferred.
